Minutes for Brazos Bluebonnet Quilt Guild Tuesday, June 14, 2016

Welcome – The meeting was opened at 7 p.m. by President **Sue Idol** at the Brazos Center.

Scholarship Recipients – Mary Ann Durbin introduced the two young ladies in attendance who were chosen for BBQG scholarships: Hailey Goodman and Hannah Hunt. The quilts, made by Ettie Hurst and quilted by Norma Reel, were shown, and each recipient thanked the membership for the honor. Ettie has already made two more quilts for next year, but a quilter is needed to complete them.

Minutes – Motion was made to accept the Minutes by **Peggy Mobley** and seconded by **Charles Gilreath**; Minutes approved.

Treasurer's Report – **Benita Ebel** reported a 5/31 balance of \$11,061.32 in the checking account and \$16,818.76 in the Savings account, making a total of \$27,880.08. She stated an additional \$3,000 in Summer Retreat income was deposited in June, due to a delay getting to the bank.

Benita noted \$5,000 is budgeted for donation quilt income and to date only \$1,293 has come in. The membership was urged to take \$20 in tickets each to sell or keep.

At its June meeting, the Board discussed the advantage of making the Treasurer position a two-year term to enable easier handling of the Quilt Show finances every second year. As the change does not require a By-Laws amendment, the Board voted to enact this change, and **Benita Ebel** has consented to serve for the second year.

Sunshine & Shadows – Lynn Thurston reported names of those who received cards since the last meeting. **Carol Laughlin** sent a thank you note for her S&S card received during shoulder surgery and expressed her appreciation of comfort it provided. **Ann Gilreath** has provided handmade cards for the Guild to use for Sunshine & Shadows.

Membership – **Nadine Stuth** reported 45 members and four visitors were in attendance. Visitors included the two scholarship recipients and Marie Herridge and Trish Wright from the Bellville Quilt Guild who brought their donation quilt to share ticket opportunities. Door prizes were won by **Sharon Braunagel** and **Nichole Pavel**.

Care Quilts – Linda Bridges reported over 17 members turned out for the Workshop held earlier in the day, and at least 18 quilts were completed. Linda reported that **Luci Smith**, who turned 89 years young last week, is retiring from her position as Care Quilt chairman, and the membership gave her a round of applause for her service. **In the 20 years Luci has been chairman**, **4,209 care quilts have been gifted to recipients.** Care Quilts are provided to Hospice, St. Joseph's Cancer Center, Phoebe's House, and Pre-Natal. **A volunteer is needed to replace Luci as chairman**. Supplies can now be stored at the Guild's climate-controlled storage location on Harvey Road.

Houston Coalition of Quilt Guilds – Sue Idol reported that a letter from the Kingwood Quilt Guild has invited BBQG to join the Houston Coalition of Quilt Guilds, which meets twice a year and shares information and speaker/workshop opportunities. **Charles Gilreath** and **Melody Nelson** will attend the next meeting on June 27th.

Soldier Squares – **Sue Idol** reported finding a certificate and a flag flown over Iraq in 2011 as gifts of appreciation from soldiers who received Soldier Squares from BBQG. They were framed by **Maggie McGuire** and were placed in the Guild's window at the Brazos Center after the meeting.

Programs – Melody Nelson has sign-up sheets for three future workshops. There is no program *...continued on page 5*
