BBQG Meeting Minutes - June 2018

The meeting was called to order by president Maggie McGuire at 7:00 p.m. on June 12th at the Brazos Center. There were 69 members in attendance, including five

new members, and nine visitors. Maggie explained to those attending that we would be limiting the business portion of the meeting to thirty minutes to allow more time for our program. Sunshine and Shadows will now follow the meeting before show and tell.

Minutes – A motion was made by Kerry Dwyer and seconded by Rozan Coody to approve the May minutes as published in the newsletter. The minutes were approved.

Programs - Sharon Braunagel showed us beautiful sample quilts for the next two workshops — Basketful of Diamonds by Vicki McGowen in July, and Circular Borders by Gail Garber in August. Sign up sheets for these workshops were passed around.

Donation Quilt – Janet Kirkpatrick provided sign up sheets for upcoming appearances of the donation quilt, including two dates at JoAnn Fabrics, the Brenham guild, and Bellville guild. Members were reminded that this is the major fundraising event for our guild this year, and that we are behind in ticket sales. All members are encouraged to sell at least \$25 worth of tickets. The drawing for the current donation quilt will be held September 11th.

The 2019 donation quilt top has been completed by Lynn McCartney. It will be quilted by Linda Bridges.

Scholarships – Our 2018 scholarship winners were introduced and presented with quilts.

Quilt Show – The 2019 quilt show will be held September 5-7th. The theme will be "Wild Flowers!"

Old Business:

Retreats – New Retreat Guidelines have been approved and are available on MyGrove. They will be effective with the next Winter Retreat.

Care Quilts - The annual care quilt workshop will be held June 13th at the American Legion beginning at 9am. Bring your lunch and sewing machine. All other materials will be provided.

New Business:

Brazos Valley Museum Quilt – Maggie McGuire announced that the Brazos Valley Museum has asked our guild to provide a quilt for an upcoming fundraising event in September. We will by using the pattern "Caravan Roundup", featuring applique boot blocks. Members were asked to complete individual blocks, and

a sign-up sheet was passed around for volunteers. Background fabric will be provided. The blocks need to be finished by August 1st.

Mini Quilt Show – The 2018 Mini Quilt Show will be held September 11th at 7:00 pm. We will have deserts, salty snacks, water, and tea. Margean Neve is in charge. The show will include Go Texan entries, and "What the Cluck" challenge quilts. Please let Margean know if you plan to enter a quilt. Leftover refreshments will be distributed to area first responders.

By Laws – Maggie asked if anyone had additional comments or questions concerning the proposed new by laws which were made available to members via MyGrove in May. There was no additional discussion. A motion was made by Charles Gilreath and seconded by Bunny Douglas to approve the new by laws as written. The motion was approved.

Speaker – Guild Member Bonnie Piernot gave us an excellent presentation on "Favorite Tools", with many excellent tips for improving organization and workmanship as we quilt.

Following the program, Maggie McGuire announced that Care Quilt Committee chairman Nicole Pavel will be leaving for a new job opportunity in North Carolina. Maggie thanked Nicole for her contributions to the guild, and presented her with a gift and card signed by the members. Maggie also announced that we are seeking someone to chair the Care Quilt committee. Two of our new members, Rochelle Kubricht, and Karlisa Petroski volunteered.

Nancy Searcy is collecting large shopping bags similar to those given away by Handi Quilter at shows. They will be used for walk in customers at the Brazos Valley Food Bank.

Show and Tell – Twenty members participated in Show and Tell, sharing a variety of beautiful quilts.

PIPPS – Projects in Progress Previously Started. Chair Kerry Dwyer drew the number "8", as the project from participating member's lists, to finish for show and tell at the June meeting. Nicole Pavel was this month's prize winner. So far this year, 37 members have completed 78 PIPPS projects.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:40 pm.

Care Quiet Workshop

Care Quilt Background: Care Quilts collects quilts created by members that are typically 45x45 at each monthly Guild meeting. "Bluebonnet Quilting Guild" labels are placed on the quilts before being distributed to local groups like: Hospice, Phoebe's Home, BCS Prenatal Clinic, Child Protective Services, and cancer patients. Once a year in June, the Guild has an all day Care Quilt event that focuses on hand tying quilts. Since the inception of Care Quilts, a total of 4,794 quilts have been given by the Guild.

On National Sewing Machine Day June 13th, twenty-five people came together to make Care Quilts. Progress was



amazing. With two groups tying quilts and a volunteer to take the remaining home, the stash of quilt sandwiches that need to be tied, is close to ZERO!



About the day: A station for cutting, quickly turned out fabric for binding and squaring up quilts. We had four

The stats:

- 17 completed quilts were brought to the event (Laverne 14 and Nancy 3).
- 2 quilts created, 8 quilts taken home to be hand bonded,
- 11 sandwiches to be tied (8 with Linda),
- 5 sandwiches sent home to be machine quilted,
- 3 tops to be paired with backing, and
- yards of binding ready for next year!

Awesome job and a big THANK YOU to those who came and helped us with the Care Quilt workshop.
