Meeting Minutes

May 11, 2021Brazos Bluebonnet Quilt Guild

The Guild Meeting was held by Zoom. It started at 6:33 pm and there were 40 participants.

Donna Bracewell, President opened the meeting with a short welcome to the guild. The guild hosted Catherine Redford who specializes in Folk Art Quilts. She also shared a simple quilt tip about saving fabric scraps.

Donna asked for a motion to approve the February guild meeting minutes. Judy Beskow made the motion and Sue Chrysler 2nd it. The minutes were approved.

The treasurer's report was read by Susan Beasley. Donna requested a motion to approve it. Sue Chrysler made the first motion to approve it and it was 2nd by Karen Knabe . The report was approved by the guild.

Nelda Cohan shared the membership numbers with the group. Currently, there are 103 paid members. Nelda will post the current membership list on GroupWorks by the end of the week.

NEW BUSINESS:

Donna reviewed the time line for the BBQG Quilt Show which will be held June 15-18 2022. Chair positions are needed for: Front Desk Ticket Sales, Hospitality chair who will work on food for workers and vendors, and Raffle Ticket Sales. If you can help in any capacity, your time will be much appreciated. Donna will be contacting the Chairs for the show to set up a meeting.

Treasurer Position: The BBQG Board has made the decision to keep Susan Beasley on as our Treasurer for 2022. The ByLaws Article V, Section 5.07 states the treasurer serves for no more than two consecutive years, but an exception has been made because of Covid and the upcoming quilt show. There were no objections to having Susan serve another year.

Linda Bridges brought up questions about whether an audit has been done. She was directed by Charles Gilreath that this is a topic for the Board to discuss.

Programs:

Announcement that Laura North is moving away and Denise Mackan is assuming the role of program director at this time. Denise mentioned that the guild will be able to do Friday workshops at the American Legion Post in 2022. She mentioned the upcoming LeMoyne Star Workshop and that she will send out the workshop information by email.

Janet Kirkpatrick spoke about the progress of the Western themed raffle quilt. She stressed that all blocks need to be completed by the end of June. Blocks should be turned in as soon as they are completed to Janet as another person may be adding additional work to the block. Zoom Bee: Denise shared information about the second meeting of the bee. Quite a few people attended. Some people worked on personal projects and Denise was even able to help someone get through a project. The bee will continue to meet the 3rd Thursday of the month. Donna introduced the speaker, Catherine Redford. Catherine is a nationally known speaker. She is a fiber artist and has created many beautiful works of art using different fibers and incorporating embroidery into the pieces. She has traveled worldwide studying fiber art and developing her own ideas for projects based on local cultures in the places she has visited. She presented many of her projects for the audience to see.

Sue Chrysler concluded the show with a show and tell slide show. She included the quilts that Nancy Searcy donated to the scholarship recipients. She commented on each of the projects submitted.

The meeting ended at 8:32 pm.

Who's Pixey

There is information about Pixey posted on GroupWorks but I wanted to know more of her quilting journey. I asked the following questions:



- When did you begin your quilting journey?
- What inspired you to begin quilting and continue quilting?
- Who is your favorite quilt artist and why?
- What is your most inspiring quilt adventure?
- Anything else you would like to share about your quilt journey.

Here are Pixey's responses:

I began my quilting journey with some BBQG workshops and Deb DeRoche classes at Lone Star Quiltworks in 2009. I was looking at exploring my creative side more to balance the procedural emphasis of my job. I was also interested in expanding my sewing interests and wanted to learn some quilting techniques to incorporate into my purse making and home decor projects, such as placemats and wall hangings. I was also exploring machine embroidery and incorporating it into quilts seemed to be a natural evolution. I tend to prefer doing smaller lighter weight quilts, such as baby or lap quilts or wall hangings.

I really don't have a favorite quilt artist. I find some aspect of most quilts interesting and enjoy learning about the artist's creative process, even if it is a technique that is not likely to be in my repertoire because of personal taste or required manual dexterity. To be honest, my answer would be similar if you asked about favorite authors, favorite musicians, favorite artists, etc.

I think my most inspiring quilt adventure was when I participated in my first Guild Care Quilt Workday. Seeing all that productivity toward a common goal and the finished quilts at the end of the day going to people in need really left a lasting impression on me. Since then, some of my most memorable projects have been baby quilts for some friends with NICU babies.

Because of time limitations while I was working and competition from my other creative hobbies, my quilting output has tended toward panel or onepiece wonders with interesting fabrics and pieced borders. However, I have often added machine embroidery elements for some uniqueness and my wall hangings tend to include some hot fix crystal bling. I hope to explore more quilt styles and techniques now that I am retired.

And one final comment, "During my year as President I hope to focus on making the Guild more welcoming for novice quilters."

If you are thinking about entering, this link gives you all the information needed to enter.

Here are a few important points:

There are 2 divisions: Machine Quilted and Hand Quilted. Both these divisions have these 5 categories

- appliqué,
- piecework,
- pictorial (theme quilt),

- wall hanging (minimum size is 18" x 18"; maximum size is 60" x 60"), and
- mixed technique (which includes any technique not covered in other specific categories).

Timeline for entries:

Nov. 2	Call for entry opens, online entry only
March 21	Entry deadline
March 22 - 23	Jurying
March 24	Entry notifications made, along with shipping & return instructions for accepted quilts.
April 8	Pieces accepted must be received in Rodeo offices by this date. Advise tracking method as questions regarding receipt of quilt will not be acknowledged.
April TBD	Judging
May 3	Result announced on website
June 1 - 4	All quilts will be return shipped or available for pick-up
