NEW BUSINESS:

Donna led a discussion that the guild will need the use of the American Legion Hall for other meetings,

not just monthly guild meetings. The board approved an amount of \$2100 per year or \$175.00 per month to cover the use of the hall for any additional activities. This amount is still less than the fees charged by the Brazos Center.

The Quilt Show Committee will meet on the 4th Tuesday of every month at the American Legion Hall.

The BBQG Quilt show is scheduled for June 15-18, 2022. The theme of the show is "A World of Color." The challenge quilt chaired by Maggie is "Color Outside the Box" She will be getting a flyer together and will post it on GroupWorks. The White Elephant Committee has been busy acquiring material and other goods. Marjean Neve and Donna Bracewell went to Joyce Blasi's sale and picked up quite a few items. Many thanks to her for the donations to the Guild!! If anyone has room in their home to store some boxes of items for that booth, please let Melody Nelson, Chris Deppe, Marjean Neve, or Gwen Koval know. If you have any items or baskets for the Basket Blitz booth, please talk to Kitty Ard. Kay Fitzpatrick Simmons has volunteered to chair the Front Desk Ticket Sales. Rachelle Kubricht has volunteered for the Hospitality committee. Big thanks to both of them for volunteering!!!! The raffle quilt is still in progress...almost done. The quilt needs to be finished soon so it can by quilted. There is still a vacancy for the Raffle Ouilt Sales. Someone is needed to coordinate times, places, and personnel where the raffle quilt can by displayed to sell tickets. If you are interested in this position, please let Donna know. Members could sign up in pairs to take the quilt to local quilt stores or other locations. Remember that the money raised from the raffle quilt tickets is the money that we use for scholarships.

Denise Mackan is in charge of programs through December 2022. She has a program making the Lemoyne Trails scheduled for two weekends in June, the 19th and the 26th. The cost is \$20.00 for the class. For the July 8th meeting, everyone

should bring their challenge quilt from last fall and be ready to turn them in. The top 4 quilts will be auctioned off in the fall. On July 17 and 24, Michelle Banton of Little Pup Designs will present a workshop on a Dresden neighborhood. Cost is \$25.00 for the class. The October meeting will have 2 classes presented by Phyllis Cohen. It is about Portraits: All about Faces. See GroupWorks for more information on these classes.

The Zoom Bee met again in May and reportedly had a good time. It will continue to meet as long as people attend.

To conclude the meeting, Sue Chrysler presented Show and Tell of members completed projects.

Remember that starting in July the guild meetings will be live in person at the American Legion Hall. The meeting will be on July 8th (the second Thursday of the month). Doors open at 6:00pm and the meeting will start at 6:30. We hope to see everyone there.

BBQG Proposed By-Laws Change

Presented to membership at meeting on July 8, 2021. Will be voted on at the meeting on August 12, 2021

BASIS FOR CHANGE: After discussion in 2020 and early 2021, the decision was made to move the monthly meetings from the 2nd Tuesday of the month at the Brazos Center to the 2nd Thursday of the month at the American Legion Post #159. While the current bylaws do allow the Board to change the dates and times of the meeting with appropriate announcement, there is also wording specifically referring to having the meeting on Tuesday that needs to be addressed.

CURRENT BYLAWS WORDING:

3.01 ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING: An annual meeting of the members shall be held on the second Tuesday of January, in each year, beginning with the year 1991, at the hour of 7:00p.m. for the transaction of business as may come before the meeting. If the day fixed for the annual business shall be on a legal holiday in the State of Texas, such meeting shall be held on the next succeeding Tuesday.

3.02 REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING: Regular business meetings, of the Guild will be held on the second Tuesday of each month. However, the time of the regular meeting of the Guild may be any other date chosen by a majority of the Board of Directors upon notification. The purpose of the regular meetings is to further the purposes for which the corporation was organized and to act on any item which may be brought before members.

PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGE IN **WORDING:**

3.01 ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING: An annual meeting of the members shall be held during January of each year for the transaction of the business of the guild.

3.02 REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING: Regular business meetings of the Guild will be held at a consistent, previously announced time and day each month. The time and date may be changed by a majority of the Board with prior notification of the membership. The purpose of the regular meetings is to further the purposes for which the corporation was organized and to act on any item which may be brought before the members.




Mary Jane butterfly quilt.


