# Brazos Bluebonnet Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes

#### August 12, 2021

The BBQG meeting was held at the American Legion Hall on August 12, 2021. The meeting was also held by Zoom for those members unable to attend in person. There were 29 members present, 11 present by Zoom, two visitors, and one new member. The meeting began at 6:30 pm. Donna Bracewell, President, welcomed all members and visitors. Visiting at the meeting were the 2 high school recipients of the scholarship quilts which were donated by Nancy Searcy. The students were introduced by JoAnn Williams and each student gave a brief talk on their plans for college and their goals for the future.



Door prizes were drawn and the winners were Marjean Neve, Kerry Fisher, and Denise Mackan.

Donna asked for a motion to approve the July Guild minutes which were printed in the newsletter. Charles Gilreath made the first motion, Denise Mackan 2<sup>nd</sup> it and the attending membership all said aye for approval.

Donna asked for a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Charles Gilreath made the first motion, Rachelle Kubricht  $2^{nd}$  the motion, and the membership all approved it.

At last month's meeting, the members were provided with the proposed By Laws change about the Guild's meeting time and day. Donna asked for a motion to approve the By Laws change. Linda Shamblin made the motion and Bunny Douglas 2<sup>nd</sup> it. The change was approved by all membership present.

#### New Business:

Diana DeFrancesco spoke about a new opportunity for the members. She has agreed to start a new sewing group called First Friday Sew-In. The group will be free and membership in the guild is required. The group will meet in the back room of the American Legion Hall starting on September 3, 2021. The meetings will be held on the first Friday of every month from 10:00 am – 4:30pm. Members can bring their own quilt projects to work on or can bring crochet, knit, or needlepoint projects also. Members can bring a lunch or snacks. There are no eating utensils or cups available so each person needs to bring their own supplies, including paper plates, and napkins/paper towels. Diana will be posting all the information in GroupWorks.

Marjean Neve has graciously volunteered to host the Christmas Party this year which will be held in the meeting room of the American Legion on December 9, 2021. Marjean has said that there will be a meal as in the past. Everyone will be asked to bring a dish for the meal. There will not be a gift exchange this year. Members are asked to bring in something homemade, which does not have to be a Christmas theme. Items will be auctioned off and the proceeds will go to the Food Bank.

#### Update on the BBQG Quilt Show – June 15-18,2022:

Sandra Smith has volunteered for the Raffle Quilt Chair. Sandra will coordinate with Denise Mackan to get places lined up to take the quilt for ticket sales. She will encourage members to take the quilt for ticket sales and will provide them with tickets to sell, handouts about our guild, and give them the new "bookmarks" to distribute. She will ensure that the quilt is at our meeting unless it is showing elsewhere. All money from ticket sales will be turned in to the treasurer, Susan Beasley.

A Quilt Angel Chair is still needed. The chair will coordinate the hourly schedule for Quilt Angels to assist with the exhibit quilts. Quilt Angels wear white gloves and provide assistance to attendees that wish to see the back of the quilts or to see more detail. Volunteers are needed for these positions.

Update on the Texas Raffle Quilt: Janet Kirkpatrick reported that all the blocks are completed and she is working on the border. She is hoping for it to be completely put together by September 1.

#### **Programs:**

Denise Mackan spoke about an upcoming program to be held over 4 Saturdays starting 08/21. The project is a Krista Moser pattern called "The Wreath Quilt Sampler". The program is taught by Laura North and is free to guild members. Email Denise Mackan if interested in attending the classes. Patterns can be ordered from Krista Moser online.

A volunteer is still needed to lead the Winter Retreat. Contact Denise Mackan if interested.

#### Miscellaneous:

Kitty Ard asked that members write down their volunteer hours. These hours can include hours working in bees such as Quilts of Valor, Care Quilts, and other guild activities.

Donna Bracewell gave a short talk on how to choose colors in quilting. She reviewed a book called the <u>Ultimate 3 in 1 Color Tool</u> by Joen Wolfrom.

### **Stop the Bleed**

You never want to see a beautiful quilt, usually a red/light combo, ruined by bleeding. And you will not know which fabric will bleed. Here are three products that can save a precious quilt!

Retayne is used in dyeing fabric, but it can be used to stop fabric from bleeding. I wash every piece of fabric I am concerned about bleeding with Retayne before I use it. You can hand wash it in the sink or put it in your washing machine. I usually wash like colors together.

Retayne sets the dye and prevents it from bleeding in the future. You can find it at Lone Star or Amazon. Be sure to follow the directions on the label.

Synthropal is both a detergent and it prevents the excess dye from resetting on the fabric or other fabrics. (Use Retayne on fabric before you sew it into the quilt and use Synthropal on a finished quilt that has already bled.)

Dawn Ultra dish soap can be used instead of Synthropal. It acts the same as Synthropal. It is a lot cheaper but make sure you use Dawn Ultra and do not use more than a tablespoon or two so you don't have suds everywhere!



# September Block of the Month Drawing!!!

Below is a pattern to make a block for a Block of the Month Drawing in September. You can make the block to keep and make one for a drawing at the September meeting. (or keep both) For every block you turn in, you will get your name placed in for the drawing. (For example, 3 blocks turned in, 3 chances to win.)

We are starting with a churn dash block because it is easy and fast to make! You will use any two colors that contrast, and you can use either fabric for the background. (Let's



stick with 100% cotton fabric, printed or solid – no flannel or batik.)



Please be as accurate as you can with cutting and sewing so the results create the correct block size.

You will need the following pieces from one light print

#### and one dark print:

- 4-3 7/8" squares,
- $1 3\frac{1}{2}$ " square,
- 2-2 x 20" strips. (If you lay the two fabrics right sides together, you can cut both at the same time.)

Take a light 3 7/8" square and draw a diagonal line on the reverse side from corner to corner. Place the light fabric right sides together on a dark fabric square and sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line to yield two half square triangles (HSTs). Open the half square triangle unit and press seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Trim "dog ears". The finished square should now measure 3 1/2" square. Make 8 HST units. Next take one light and one dark 2" strip and stitch together along one long edge with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press the seam allowances toward the darker fabric. Cut the strip unit into  $4 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Reserve the leftovers for the optional pieced border. Repeat with the second set of strips.

Lay out the HSTs, strip units, and a center square as shown in the pictures above and stitch together to make two 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Churn Dash blocks. (They will finish 9")
