## September 2021 Meeting Minutes....

The BBQG held their monthly meeting at the American Legion Hall on September 9, 2021. The meeting was called to order at 6:34 p.m. by guild President Donna Bracewell.

Membership - There were 34 members present. $700+$ volunteer hours were recorded. Currently we have 117 members.

Door Prizes - Sue Ryan distributed 3 door prizes to lucky winners - Susan Beasley, Diana DeFrancesco, and Janet Kirkpatrick.

Minutes - A motion was made by Charles Gilreath and $2^{\text {nd }}$ by Linda Shamblin to approve the August 2021 meeting minutes as written in the newsletter. Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report - Marjean Neve made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report as printed in the newsletter and Sue Idol $2^{\text {nd }}$ the motion. Members approved the report.

Programs - Denise Mackan began with the BOM Churn Dash block drawing. Janet Kirkpatrick was the lucky winner of the churn dash blocks. Denise then discussed her plan to continue the BOM program into 2022. Directions for our next block, Ohio Star, will be published in the newsletter. The Ohio Star blocks will be due in October. Rhonda Kuboviak had previously suggested at the board meeting to encourage members to make 2 blocks, turning in one for the drawing and one to be used in a care quilt. Blocks should measure 12.5 " unfinished. Then beginning in November 2021, members will be provided directions for another block that will be due in January 2022. Nancy Searcy suggested the blocks be a consistent color theme so they would be more pleasing to the eye as they are incorporated into a quilt. Additionally, Denise reported several members are participating in the zoom workshop with Laura North constructing a wreath wall hanging using the $60^{\circ}$ triangle ruler from Krista Moser. Denise also mentioned she would be sending a zoom link to all members for the Thursday Zoom Bee, and everyone is welcome.

Go Texan Quilt - The Board made the decision to select the GTQ entry by membership vote at the October Guild Meeting. Entries must be at the October meeting to allow membership to view and vote on their choice. If any member has a quilt they would like to be considered as the GTQ but are unable to attend, Pixey Mosley has graciously offered to bring the quilt to the meeting. Please contact Pixey if you need her assistance in getting your quilt to the meeting. Members must be present to vote, and voting will be by paper ballot.
Remember, the GTQ does not require a "Western or Texas Theme." A Link to the Go Texan Quilt contest has been provided for you in Groupworks. Please review all rules for entry.

2020 Mini Quilt Auction - The Mini Quilt Contest winning quilts will also be silent auctioned at the

October meeting. Other quilts entered in the Mini Quilt Show are to be donated as Care Quilts. If you have one of these quilts, please bring to the October meeting to be given to our Care Quilt Coordinator.

Raffle Quilt 2022 - The current Raffle quilt has traveled to several locations. Denise provided signup sheets for members to help take the quilt to various destinations. The Brazos Valley Fair is one of these and is rapidly approaching. Also Saturday, Sept 25, Parc@ Traditions and in October the Tall Pines Quilt Guild in Huntsville are proposed destinations. If you can help, please contact Denise Mackan or Sandra Smith.

Raffle Quilt 2023 - Janet Kirkpatrick, showed the progress to date for this quilt. We are down to the final border pieces. Chris Deppe is also appliqueing the last few stars.

## Quilt Show Committee -

- Quilt Angel Chair - Donna Bracewell reported all chairs filled except the Quilt Angels. This entails getting members to sign up for shifts at the show, wear a glove and show the back of quilts to interested quilt show attendees.
- White Elephant Pricing Party Marjean Neve gave an update on the pricing party. Charles Gilreath, Melody Nelson, Pixey Mosley, Sue Ryan, and Marjean Neve attended and were able to accomplish a lot of work.
- Bluebonnet Shop for the Quilt Show Donna Bracewell reminded all that we will need items for the Bluebonnet Shop. Suggestions include baby quilts, potholders, tea towels, etc... Items need to be priced before the show. In addition, Maggie McGuire has agreed to help sell members' quilts. Remember a small portion of all quilt sales go to the guild and you keep the rest.
$1^{\text {st }}$ Friday Sew-In - Diana DeFrancesco reported on the 1st Friday Sew-in held at the American

Legion Friday Sept. $3^{\text {rd }}$. There were 16 attendees, and all had a great time. Please contact Diana to register if you would like to participate in the October $1^{\text {st }}$ Friday event.

Christmas Party - Marjean Neve has agreed to chair the party, and several have volunteered to help. In lieu of the Chinese Gift Exchange, we would like members to make/provide a quilt related gift for silent auction. Proceeds from the auction will be donated to the food bank. Be looking for the signup to bring a dish for the meal as well.

Fall Retreat - Sign-up for the Fall Retreat is now open. Dates for the retreat are October 17-20, 2021. If you are interested in going, contact Melody Nelson.

Winter Retreat - Jeanne Joham reported the Winter Retreat will be the last weekend in January 2022. Signup will begin in November. The Retreat will be at Camp Lonestar in LaGrange.

Program - Donna Bracewell presented a quilters’ tip - how to use Mr. Clean sheets to remove pencil/chalk marks and how to construct a nickel block. She then presented a "Bed Turning" highlighting awesome quilts made by her mom, her daughter, and herself.

Show and Tell - The meeting concluded with the showing of a number of beautiful quilts made by our members.

The meeting adjourned at $8: 17$ p.m.

## 2022 BBQG Quilt Show World Of Color <br> 2022 Care Quilt Challenge

## Color 0utside of the Box

## RULES:

-Quilt must be at least $42^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ and must be finished.
-There is no "focus fabric", but here is the challenge. All fabric must be from your stash or you may
"shop" someone else's stash.

- Quilts will be judged by viewer's choice.
-The top three quilts will be auctioned off on Saturday at 2 pm . The rest will be donated to the guild's Care Quilt Project.

Pieced blocks, appliqué and/or fabric embellishments are encouraged, but remember it may be given to a small child so be cautious of buttons or other things that could be swallowed. Everything should be tacked down carefully and securely.

All challenge entries must complete the entry process, however, there is no registration fee.

Ohio Star is a nine-patch quilt block made with five plain squares and four quarter-square triangle units. It's a classic block that's easy to make, but do take care to sew an accurate quarter inch seam allowance when assembling the patchwork units.

## Cutting

Center Block - Cut (1) $41 / 2 "$ Square accent fabric
Star Points -
Cut (2) $51 / 2$ " Square of Accent Fabric
Cut (2) $51 / 2 "$ Square of Background Fabric
Corner Blocks -

- To make solid blocks for Corner Blocks

Cut (4) $41 / 2 "$ Square of Background Fabric

## Making units for block -

## Making Star Points

Combine a $51 / 2 "$ Accent Square with a $51 / 2 "$ Background Square, right sides together and edges matched.

Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the reverse side of background fabric.
Sew $1 / 4$ " on each side of the drawn line. After sewn together, cut along drawn line. This will create 2 half square triangles.
Make another set of half square triangles for a total of 4 half square triangles.
Using two half square triangles
Turn one half-square triangle unit to its wrong side. Using the marking pen and ruler, draw a diagonal line corner to corner, crossing the seam. (see picture below middle square)


Placing right sides together, line up the two units with contrasting triangles facing each other (same fabrics aren't stacked on top of each other!), edges matching all around. The seams should nest.

Sew a $1 / 4$ " seam on each side of the drawn diagonal line. After both seams are sewn, cut along drawn line. A quarter square triangle is created as in picture. You will need a total of 4 quarter square triangles. Trim these quarter square triangles to $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " square.

## Sewing Block Together

Arrange units as shown. Sew top three units together, then middle units together and then sew bottom units together. Sew each row together. Block should measure $121 / 2$ ".
